

For academics, given the size of our student body, the decision was made to combine our AbleLight classes. Overall, this decision has produced a number of positive outcomes, namely a renewed focus on all students being AbleLight College students as opposed to focusing on their status as first- or second- year students. Another positive outcome of combining ALC classes is the opportunity to pilot offering Financial Literacy to 1st year students, which is typically offered only to second year students. Once again, we have seen positive outcomes of opening this class up to all students and have already seen students applying what's been covered in class in their day-to-day life on-and off-campus. For CUAA classes, similarly to last semester, expectations related academics are personalized to the needs and goals of the students. Classes to note that our students are taking include America and Vietnam, Chapel Choir, Michigan History, Orchestra, and Data & Space: Teaching Pre-K-9th grade.




